Children's highchairs are found all over the world and **are self-contained seats for children under 36 months of age**. Children's highchairs can be made of plastic, wood or metal, and are usually equipped with upholstered seats. Country / Region	Standard	Definition & Scope
Europe	EN 14988	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Applies to free-standing children's highchairs that elevate children to dining table height usually for the purposes of feeding or eating. The highchair is for children under 3 years of age who are capable of sitting unaided.</li> <li>With the exception of special highchairs for medical purposes, applies to children's highchairs for domestic and non-domestic use.</li> <li>If a children's highchair has to be or can be converted to other functions, additional European Standards may apply.</li> </ul>
USA	16 CFR 1231 ASTM F404	Applies to free standing chairs that elevate a child to standard dining table height, and holds a child of up to 3 years of age, who can remain in a sitting position due to the child's own coordination, usually for feeding or eating purposes. The height from the seating surface to floor should be over 15 inches.
China	GB 22793.1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Applies to highchairs normally used for children from 6 months to 3 years of age, made for the purpose of holding a child capable of remaining in a sitting position due to his or her own coordination and which may have a tray that is attached to the chair for feeding, eating or playing. The highchair is designed to rest on the floor and to elevate the child to approximately the height of a dining table.</li> <li>Does not cover additional functions for chairs that may be convertible to low chairs, low chairs with table and for such uses as baby walking frames, pushchairs, swings, car chairs or reclining low chairs.</li> </ul>
Australia New Zealand	AS 4684	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Applies to highchairs, low chairs, and reclining chairs that can be converted into highchairs. If the chair can be converted to other uses, these additional functions and features are not included in this standard.</li> <li>In addition to this standard, the highchair must comply with at least one of the following standards: ASTM F404, EN 14988, ISO 9221.</li> </ul>
International	ISO 9221-1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Applies to highchairs, normally used for children between 6 months and 3 years of age, which is made of the purpose of holding a child capable of remaining in a sitting position due to his or her own coordination and which may have a tray that is attached to the chair for feeding, eating or playing.</li> <li>Does not cover additional functions for chairs that may be convertible to low chairs, low chairs with tables and for such uses as baby walking frames, pushchairs, swings, car chairs or reclining low chairs.</li> </ul>
